


# **WSU Wichita Metropolitan Area Indices**

# August 2016



The Center for Economic Development and Business Research has compiled the current and leading indices to provide insights into the present and future state of the Wichita economy. The WSU Current Conditions Index is designed to give an indication of the present conditions of the Wichita metropolitan area economy. The WSU Leading Economic Indicators Index is designed to give an indication of where the Wichita economy is headed over the next six months.

#### **WSU Current Index of Economic Activity**

The current index declined slightly between May and June, after increasing through the spring. The current level of economic activity, in Wichita, remains above the 2015 level. There was an increase in total non-farm employment. However, the remaining three index components deteriorated between May and June.
