

Wichita Metro Area Current Conditions Index Results for October 2012

Introduction

The WSU Current Conditions Index is designed to give an indication of the present condition of the Wichita metropolitan area economy. The WSU Current Conditions Index is composed of six monthly indicators including:

- Number of monthly home sales
- Hotel occupancy rate
- Number of outbound airline passengers
- Volume of outbound airfreight
- Number of wage and salary employed
- Civilian unemployment rate

The WSU Current Conditions Index is designed to reflect the <u>present</u> state of the economy. The WSU Leading Economic Indicators Index, on the other hand, is designed to forecast <u>future</u> movements in the economy. On the national level, The Conference Board releases the most widely followed indicators. The WSU Current Conditions Index is similar to what The Conference Board refers to as their "coincident" indicators index.

Summary of Results¹

Month to Month Comparison: September 2012 to October 2012

- WSU Current Conditions Index increased 0.4 percent
- Home sales increased 11.5 percent
- Hotel occupancy rate increased 5 percentage points
- Number of outbound airline passengers increased 1.9 percent
- Outbound airfreight shipments at the airport decreased 16.1 percent
- Wage and salary employment remained basically the same, decreasing only 0.01 percent
- Unemployment rate decreased 0.2 percentage points

Year-Over-Year Monthly Comparison: October 2011 to October 2012

- WSU Current Conditions Index increased 4.1 percent
- Home sales increased 34.5 percent
- Hotel occupancy rate increased 3.5 percentage points
- Number of outbound airline passengers increased 2.9 percent
- Outbound airfreight shipments at the airport decreased 8.8 percent
- Wage and salary employment increased 0.8 percent
- Unemployment rate decreased 1.3 percentage points

Year-to-Year Comparison: October 2011 to October 2012

(12 months ending October 2011 compared to the 12 months ending October 2012)

- WSU Current Conditions Index increased 1.7 percent
- Home sales increased 7.4 percent
- Hotel occupancy rate increased 0.1 percentage point
- Number of outbound airline passengers decreased 0.1 percent
- Outbound airfreight shipments decreased 5.9 percent
- Wage and salary employment increased 0.7 percent
- Unemployment rate decreased 1.1 percentage point

For the 13 Months Ending October 2012 (seasonally adjusted)




Figure 3. Hotel Occupancy Rate in Percent

For the 13 Months Ending October 2012 (seasonally adjusted)




Figure 4. Number of Outbound Airline Passengers

For the 13 Months Ending October 2012 (seasonally adjusted)




Figure 5. Outbound Airfreight Shipments in Pounds

For the 13 Months Ending October 2012 (seasonally adjusted)




Figure 6. Number of Non-Farm Wage & Salary Employed

For the 13 Months Ending October 2012 (seasonally adjusted)





Figure 7. Unemployment Rate in Percent
